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REPORT ON OBSERVATION OF ANTI-RAGGING DAY & ANTI-RAGGING WEEK 2026.
From 12/08/2026 to 18/08/2026

Introduction

In accordance with the communication issued by the **Directorate of Technical Education**, West Bengal, and the advisory of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and Centre for Youth (C4Y), **Anti-Ragging Day** was observed on **12th August 2026**, followed by **Anti-Ragging Week** from **12th August to 18th August 2026**. The programme aimed to create awareness regarding the harmful effects of ragging and to promote a safe, respectful and inclusive campus environment.



Objectives

The major objectives of observing Anti-Ragging Week were:

- To create awareness among students about the adverse consequences of ragging.
- To educate students about the legal and disciplinary consequences of involvement in ragging.
- To promote mutual respect, dignity, discipline and healthy interaction among students.
- To encourage students to report any incident or apprehension of ragging to the appropriate authority.
- To ensure a safe, inclusive and ragging-free campus environment.



Activities Performed by the Students

The following activities were conducted during the Anti-Ragging Week:

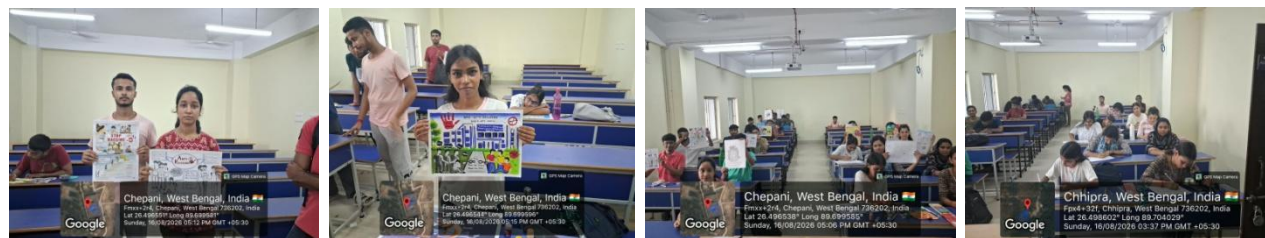
a) Anti-Ragging Awareness Rally



Students actively participated in an awareness rally within and around the college campus. They carried anti-ragging banners, posters and placards and raised slogans promoting a ragging-free campus. The rally conveyed messages such as “Say No to Ragging,” “Zero Tolerance to Ragging” and “Respect Everyone.”

b) Poster and Slogan Competition

Students participated in poster and slogan competitions based on the theme of anti-ragging. Through creative artwork and meaningful slogans, students highlighted the negative consequences of ragging and the importance of mutual respect.

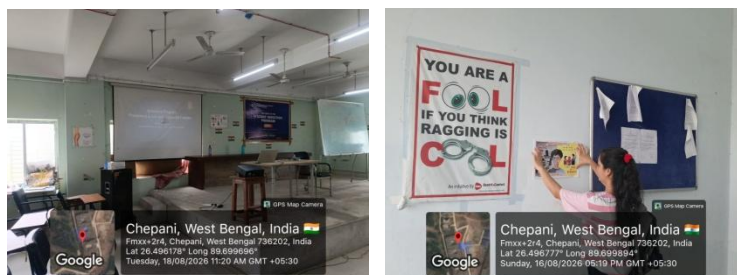


c) Essay and Painting Competition

Students participated in essay-writing and painting activities focusing on anti-ragging, student safety, dignity and the creation of a positive educational environment.

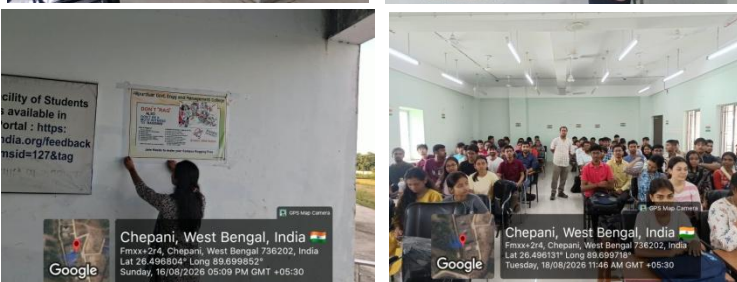
d) Awareness Seminar and Interactive Sessions

Students, along with faculty and staff members, participated in the anti-ragging pledge-taking programme and reaffirmed their commitment to maintaining a ragging-free educational environment.



g) Social Media Awareness Campaign

Students participated in a social media awareness campaign to spread the message against ragging and promote a safe and positive campus culture.

h) Display of Awareness Materials and Selfie Corner

Anti-ragging posters and banners were displayed at prominent

locations of the college campus. A selfie corner was also arranged to encourage student participation and spread awareness.

The Anti-Ragging Week activities successfully created awareness among students regarding:

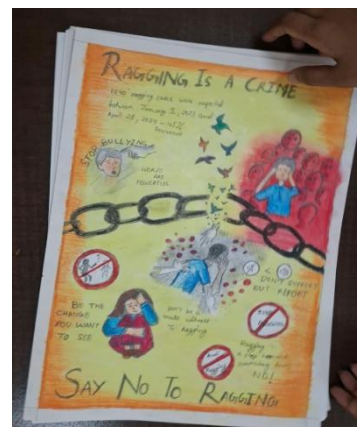
- The harmful effects and consequences of ragging.
